So our walk in May will be the Boyd Walking Tour on **Monday May 6.** We will travel by train to Caulfield catching the 10.11 am train from Cheltenham (10.04 am Mordialloc, 10.07 am Parkdale and 10.09 am. Mentone). At Caulfield we will change trains to travel to Murrumbeena. The tour commences at the station and includes visiting eight sites for which explanatory notes will be provided. At the conclusion of the walk we will have lunch at a local café.

Advance notice: Bendigo Art Gallery

For our walk on *Monday June 3*, I plan to organize a visit to the Bendigo Art Gallery to see the "Tudors to Windsors: British Royal Portraits" exhibition. We will travel by train to Southern Cross, catch the 10.22 am V-line train to Bendigo and walk or catch a bus to the Gallery which is about 15 minutes walk from the station. If travelling by bus please bring your Myki ticket. This is an opportunity to use your rail travel voucher to obtain your free V-line paper ticket, obtainable from Cheltenham, Sandringham and many other larger stations. Entry tickets to the Gallery are \$22.00 for Seniors. I intend to make a booking for entry at 2.00 pm which will allow time for lunch at a nearby café beforehand. Return trains – 3.39 pm, arriving Southern Cross 5.44 pm (Note: you will have to book an actual seat on this train when you obtain your ticket); 4.25 pm arriving Southern Cross 6.20 pm. The final date for booking and payment to me is Friday May 3.
