**Editorial**: Probus offers members of Probus or Rotary clubs, or an immediate family member (and a guest) not necessarily travelling with the member, access to the following Probus Travel Insurance plans:

- Probus Standard Travel Insurance Single Trip (Standard Travel Insurance) provides coverage for most pre-existing conditions. Standard Travel Insurance requires a fit-to-travel report (on PSPL pro forma) from your medical practitioner to be submitted with your application.
- Probus Premier Travel Insurance Single Trip (Premier Travel Insurance) provides coverage
  for some pre-existing conditions and has unlimited medical coverage in some areas. It does not
  require a fit-to-travel letter.
- Probus Premier Travel Insurance Annual Multi-Trip (Premier Travel Insurance Annual Multi-Trip) provides the same level of coverage as Premier Travel Insurance. It is designed for frequent travellers for an unlimited number of trips over a 12-month period, provided each trip is no longer than 45 days. This plan does not require a-fit-to travel report.

How much does Probus Travel Insurance Cost? The cost depends on your age, your destination and for how long you are travelling. To obtain a quotation and further information on the age related limitations, visit the Probus South Pacific Ltd website or contact its office by phone. Their FAQ's are quite useful. Applications can be submitted by email, and, if accepted, are confirmed fairly promptly in my experience. (Make sure your email address is correct.)
