Techno talk

Recently I started to watch a "SBS on Demand" TV series on my computer monitor. When I decided to continue watching it on my large so-called Smart Hisense Android TV for greater dramatic effect, I was not able to do so, as I was not able to download the "SBS on Demand" app. After many failed attempts, and gnashing of teeth, I went to Dr Google for help, using "Hisense TV SBS on Demand" as the search string.

The answer was straight-forward: the "SBS on Demand" v2 app I was using had been removed from early model Hisense TVs in March this year because they do not have the memory or processing power to run the most up to date "SBS on Demand app" launched in 2018 (known as the "v3 app"). The v2 app also doesn't have the enhanced features or improved ad experience currently available on the updated app, according to SBS.

Knowing this, I was able to connect a laptop to my Hisense TV using an HDMI cable and changing the source on the TV to the corresponding HDMI port. Alternatively, I could have used the Chromecast streaming media player that I have connected to the TV in conjunction with my Smart phone. This is the arrangement I use with the bedroom TV that can be turned on remotely by voice using a smart power plug and Google Nest device connected to my Wi-Fi network to watch Netflix, and the like.
