On *Monday December 6* we will walk under the Caulfield to Carnegie section of the "Skyrail" elevated section of railway line along the concrete path laid as part of the "Skyrail" construction. We will be able to see for ourselves what redevelopments of the area have taken place and if the locals have benefited in any way. Because of lunchtime meal time restrictions at the hotel, train times have to be later than I anticipated. Catching the 11.46 am train from Cheltenham (11.39 am Mordialloc, 11.41 am Parkdale, 11.43 am Mentone) and <u>travelling in the last carriage</u>, we will arrive at Caulfield at around 12.05 am.
