Walking group

Our walk on Monday November 11 (note the change to the second Monday of the month for this month only) will be along the Elster Creek Trail which follows the original path of the Elster Creek eventually draining into the Bay at Elwood. We will meet at 10.30 am in the car park of Allnut Park, McKinnon, at the entry point of the park directly off Wheatley Road (Melway 68 C/D 11). From here we will walk along the trail to Thomas Street and after crossing over, walk along Union Street to Hawthorn Road. After crossing Hawthorn Road and continuing along Union Street, we will turn into Sunnyside Avenue which leads into Landcox Park. After a break for refreshments at Café Bliss in Mavis Street, which is adjacent to the park, we will return to Allnut Park. The total walk is approximately 5 kilometres.

December walk

Our next walk will be on *December 3* when we will walk along part of the "Scotchman's Creek Trail" in Oakleigh. At 10.30 am we will meet in Atkinson Street, Oakleigh (where parallel street parking is available). On the right-hand side of the street, just past the parallel street parking area, a concrete path is visible, and this is where we join the Trail. On our return, for those who would like to have lunch, we will walk along Atkinson Street to Dandenong Road, turn right and make our way to Castello's Foresters Arms Hotel.

January 2025 walk

On Monday *January 6* we will have the first twilight walk for the year in Karkarook Park in Warrigal Road on the corner of Fairchild Street, Moorabbin (adjacent to Bunnings Warehouse). We will meet at 6.30 pm in the first car park after entering the Park from Fairchild Street (Melway 78, E 8). Following the walk, we will meet at either *Arcobar* in Arco Lane (next turn off Warrigal after Fairchild Street) or *McDonalds* (further south after Fairchild Street adjacent to Coles Express).

February 2025 walk

On Monday *February 3* we will have our traditional gelati twilight walk. We will meet at 7.00 pm on the corner of Bluff Road and Spring Street, Sandringham (Melway 76 K12). Parking is available in Spring Street or Bluff Road. The government-funded programme is designed to support older Australians aged 50 plus to develop their digital skills and confidence through free face-to-face contact, either one-on-one or in small groups, utilising the learning courses available on the *BeConnected* learning site. With the \$2,500 grant that was obtained by them, four iPads and two Samsung Galaxy tablets were bought to be used in training our members; some members have also been shown how to use their mobile phones.
