# **Immigration Museum**

A reminder that on *Thursday 10th July* I have organised a trip to the Immigration Museum from 10.30 to 12 noon - travelling by train to Flinders Street station then a walk or tram ride to the venue. Entry is free for all concession card holders and \$10 for Seniors. Travel arrangements are as follows: meet in the back carriage on the Frankston line 9.16am train from Cheltenham (Parkdale 9.11am; Highett 9.20am). Afterwards I suggest a casual lunch at Brunetti's (250 Flinders Lane) but that is your choice.

# **Bendigo outing**

Nineteen Club members made it to Bendigo, either by train or car, on Thursday 12th June. After a quick lunch at the Bridgewater Bakery, it was a short walk in the sunshine to the art gallery for the Frida Kahlo exhibition. This was an intimate account of this artist's life - we were all captivated by the life she lived despite her disabilities. Those of us who had the opportunity to watch *Frida*, the movie on Netflix beforehand, commented on how helpful that was as we delved further into her fascinating love affairs and two marriages with the renowned artist Diego Rivera.

This precious collection of her personal belongings, clothing, make-up, accessories and medical items had been sealed in a bathroom for 50 years - and Bendigo is the first Australian gallery to offer this exhibition to the public.

Six of us stayed overnight in Bendigo and visited what is the largest Stupa in the Western World. It is some twenty minutes out towards Myers's Flat, set in bushland. The Stupa is surrounded by a Peace Park with twenty-one interfaith symbols and is the only one of its kind, in the world.

This Tibetan structure is amazing and a work in progress as it is based on a 100-year plan - and is being built to last 1,000 years. It is the most sacred building in Buddhism and was blessed by His Holiness the Dalai Lama in 2007. It is an active organisation that offers a place of peace and harmony for all beings - as we drove back into Melbourne amongst the Friday afternoon traffic we kept reflecting on the contrast in our experience -from absolute peace to chaos!
